

COURSE AND CONTACT DETAILS

Accommodation is with **host families**, who provide all meals, including packed lunch on course and departure days, and, where needed, transport to and from the centre each day. The course is greatly enhanced by the quality of our host families, who offer warm hospitality to guests and in the evening for relaxed conversation, maybe with a teacher from another country who is also on the course. It is an excellent opportunity to spend time communicating in English naturally - something that most teachers don't often get time for!

Application for any course can be made by letter or e-mail at any time to the address below. Once you have confirmed your ability to take part, we will send all details regarding payments, and an information sheet, which we will ask you to complete and return to us. This helps with the planning of the course, travel plans and placement with an appropriate host family. A 10% deposit is all that is required to book a place. We also have a DVD for you on request.

Travel to and from England is the individual's responsibility and is not included in the price, though advice can be given. SOL will organise all travel to Devon for **morning** arrivals in London on **July 8th, 22nd or Aug 15th**. Heathrow Terminal 5 is the meeting point, which is accessible from all London airports. Transport to Devon is included in the price plus all travel within the programme. At the end of the course, all will be taken to Heathrow and London Victoria by noon. Those with later flights will be able to have a short sightseeing in London.

This course is run by trainers who have current and considerable experience of both teaching and teacher training especially in central Europe, so you can be sure the whole course will be relevant to your needs. Each one is an intensive but very enjoyable course offering teachers of English a unique combination of new interactive classroom strategies, improved confidence in speaking English and a varied and well planned cultural experience. Our summer 2011 courses saw participants from twelve different European countries as well as Morocco!.

The Daily Programme runs from 08.30 to 18.00 with normally at least an hour for lunch, Monday to Saturday. Sunday is a day with the family. Most of the time will be with the tutors but guided visits to local places of interest and a fieldwork approach will give added value to these. Time for discussion and independence plus social time in the evening when you are not with families won't be forgotten. For shopping, SOL is situated right next to the town centre!

Prices are set to only cover our costs. SOL has a policy not to make a profit out of teachers, because we know how under-paid you are! The second course is one day longer than the first.



ABOUT SOL

Since 1991 SOL has been supporting the teaching and learning of English in the countries of Eastern and Central Europe.

More than 38,000 students, plus their accompanying teachers have attended our short but intensive cultural and language experiences which are highly practical and are aimed at giving students a lot more confidence in using English in everyday situations.

We operate in three centres in Devon, all quite small market towns with populations less than 30,000, but full of friendly people. Our main Centre is in Barnstaple, the 'capital' of North Devon and just 12km from the Atlantic Ocean and this centre operates all year round. We also have centres in Bideford, also in the north of the county and Tiverton, nearer the centre.

More than 1,250 teachers have attended our special highly practical in-service courses designed to introduce them to the life and culture in Britain as well as develop language knowledge and confidence and to introduce fresh ideas for teaching and classroom management.

In addition an important part of SOL's work has been to recruit good native speaker teachers to teach in State schools in the countries of Eastern and Central Europe. Currently 16 such teachers are in post but in the past this has been as high as 70. This way many more students, who couldn't afford to visit the UK, as well as their teachers, have benefited from our work.

COURSE C

Course C: "Devon Unplugged".

August 15th to 25th

"Success depends less on materials, techniques and linguistic analyses, and more on what goes on inside and between people in the classroom" Earl Stevick

Would you like to get to know Britain better through going to a beautiful part of the country by the sea, a place where you will have many opportunities to use your English and listen to English spoken by a wide range of people in the local community?

Would you like to get to know North Devon in an unplugged, materials-light, conversation-driven way?

Would you also like to take part in an experience which leaves plenty of space for teachers' own decision-making regarding both the content and the process of the course?

This completely new SOL course is based on a methodology which values spontaneity, thinking on one's feet and learner contributions. We will model a way of working that can be applied in many teaching situations and which is based on topics and language that emerge on the course.

Project work will be negotiated with the teachers and much of the course will involve interaction with local people. The classroom will be a place where we explore an unplugged approach, work with what participants have discovered while out and about in North Devon and discuss how this way of working might be integrated into teachers' own classroom contexts.

The sea, lifeboats, lifeguards, surfing, beach life and holidays are key aspects of life in North Devon and an exploration of how these elements of North Devon are interconnected might be one area teachers concentrate on.

Both Luke Meddings and Mark Andrews have worked with teachers in Devon and are keen to break new ground on a course which values a "less is more" approach, breaks down the barriers between 'inside' and 'outside' the classroom, promotes choice and encourages teachers to help their learners to take more responsibility for their learning.

COURSE A

COURSE A : "AUTHENTIC ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND CULTURE".

July 8th to 18th

Do you feel you'd like to get to know Britain better through going to a beautiful part of the country by the sea and to a place where you will have many opportunities to use your English and listen to English spoken by a wide range of people in the local community?

Would you like to take part in a course which focuses on finding out about the language and exploring the country in deeper ways through engaging more actively with people in Britain instead of being just a tourist?

This exciting new course is designed to meet current needs and interests of Eastern and Central European English teachers. Firstly, it should help you to improve your own speaking skills, giving you more confidence in using your own English. Secondly, it will involve you in a comparative approach to exploring modern British culture and equip you with the tools to do the same with your own students in a safe environment and with tutors who will give you support and encouragement to do this.

Hopefully, by the end of the course, you will be more at ease with speaking to people in Britain and be more familiar with the values, beliefs and attitudes which underlie what people say to you. You should also be able to identify and understand better the differences and similarities between life in modern Britain and your own country.

You will also have collected many materials, some of which we will work with on the course to develop into tasks which you might do with your students back home.

- Trainers will teach all topics interactively.
- 'Fieldwork' visits to local towns and the Atlantic coast are an integral part of the course, forming the basis for a range of project linked classroom activities.
- Homework tasks will be set to encourage you to discuss contemporary language and cultural issues with your host families.
- There will be opportunities to discuss British life with visitors from the local community. This, in the past, has included the local Member of Parliament, a fashion designer, a property letting agent, life guards on the beach, a Green candidate in the general election, a local primary school teacher and the manager of the Grand Hotel, Torquay, where Agatha Christie spent her honeymoon.

There is a 14 day un-subsidised parallel course running from July 8th to 21st. However this is eligible for EU grants, such as Comenius, Erasmus and Gruntvig.

COURSE B

COURSE B : "The Reflective English Teacher".

July 22nd to August 2nd

Hearing about new teaching ideas at conferences and in books and journals is one thing – applying to your own teaching is quite another! This is the ideal course for teachers determined to bridge the gap between theory and practice and improve their classroom teaching. Taking a strong 'evidence based' approach to professional development, the course will allow participants to experiment with new teaching strategies that they can use immediately when they return to their home countries. The course will naturally make full use of SOL's location in South West England to help develop participant's awareness of contemporary British language and culture.

By the end of the course participants will be able to use a focused range of interactive teaching strategies.

These will include:

- Drama and dialogue activities
- Preparing students to deliver formal presentations
- Use of images in the classroom
- Five minute activities
- Creative writing tasks
- Use of music and song lyrics
- Formative assessment strategies (Assessment For Learning)

Delivery

- Trainers will both demonstrate new strategies and, explain why they are effective in the classroom
- Where appropriate, links will be made with preparing students for specific exams commonly taken in Central and Eastern Europe
- The trainers will often differentiate to meet the needs of teachers teaching young learners, teenagers and adults at all ability levels.
- Throughout the course participants will be encouraged to reflect on their own classroom practice and critically evaluate new strategies, often through discussions with other participants on the course
- Participants will have opportunity to try these activities out in lesson planning and micro-teach activities
