Language Point•

When we talk about **normal routines**, we usually use the **definite article (the)**,

e.g. I take the bus to school every day.

You can use a **definite or indefinite (a/an)** article to talk about a single journey.

e.g. Shall we take a bus to the cinema tonight?

The metro or **specific lines** (e.g. the yellow line, the number 22 tram) get the **definite article**.

e.g. Should I take the #13 bus to the airport?
